## what is being done?


**This is a very difficult time for our community** – at time of writing, we have just been informed that there is a ‘lock down’ for at least three weeks, that people should only leave their homes for essential shopping, health needs, work (if it cannot be done from home) and once a day to exercise.

We are, as you can imagine, concerned that there are likely to be even greater challenges to come. People who are alone needing to get food, people who are experiencing symptoms needing supplies, families who are restricted finding it hard being stuck at home – it will be a difficult time. But we know that our communities are some of the strongest in the city and we know that people will look out for each other, help each other out and make sure that people aren’t alone in this.

Woughton Community Council is working with residents, community groups, resident associations, charities and others to try and coordinate efforts. # Landscape Schedule 2020/2021

WOUGHTON COMMUNITY COUNCIL



Grass Cutting commences middle to end of March and will continue through to the beginning of November and hopefully achieve 12 cuts during this period weather conditions permitting.

Please can I remind all dog owners not only is it an offence to leave dog faeces on ground in Public Open Spaces but very unpleasant for our Landscape team who have to maintain our mowers, which could be contaminated with dog waste.

The route will start off in **Eaglestone** then continue through **Leadenhall, Coffee Hall, Bleak Hall, Redmoor, Beanhill, Netherfield, Tinkers Bridge** and finishing off in **Peartree Bridge** and will be undertaken primarily by two zero turn ride-on mowers.

**Herbicide** application (weed spraying) starts in late March early April and will generally follow the same estate route however if mowers are on the same estate spraying will move onto another to avoid contamination onto grass areas. Another application will commence in late autumn in order to suppress late emerging weeds.



In between all this scheduled work we will react to any landscape enquiries (if deemed to be urgent) these will be addressed as soon as possible.

**Hedge cutting** will carry on through the summer and continue through the winter at the end of this year and beginning of next year. During the bird nesting season selected hedge cutting will be done to avoid disturbance.

In the last edition of the Gazette, we published a draft budget for the coming financial year and asked for your view on this. Whilst we got some feedback, it wasn't as much as we had hoped and so we will be looking at how we can do better this year.

The feedback we did have was generally supportive and recommended that we proceed with the planned budget. However, there were some who felt that any rise in precept was unnecessary and that we should do more with the money we have.

As a local council, we are subject to strict rules around spending – this can be found in our Financial Regulations on the website. The biggest rule for everyone in the council is to find ‘best value’ – not always the cheapest, but the best overall value. This means that everything we spend can be accounted for, everything we spend must be authorised (usually by the full council or committee) and where possible, we look at how we can get things donated, reduced or otherwise better value.

We do a huge amount with the money we raise (and about half our income is through things other than the precept);

- **the best youth service** in the city, supporting hundreds of young people every week, helping reduce anti-social behaviour, providing advice and support, specialist services for those most in need and open Play Ranger sessions for the whole family.
- **the only ‘in house’ landscape team** within the parish sector that has been delivering since the start – whilst never enough, much better than the previous service.
- **an advice service** that saves local people tens of thousands of pounds each year, helps reduce homelessness and has supported thousands of people and families.

- **A Community Fridge** that has saved over 20 tonnes of food being wasted and helped hundreds of local people access food.
- **An environment team** that has helped increase recycling, decrease fly-tipping, removed 56 tonnes of dog waste and worked on several projects to improve the estates, with more to come.
- **The new Wellbeing Room** and support service that means people have somewhere safe and supportive to come.
- Our **community centres** that provide affordable space to dozens of groups, parties, celebrations, fundraisers and more, with refurbishment taking place across the centres.
- **Training and support** to residents associations and local charitable groups; over £25,000 of support last year in direct funding, training, access to space, grants and resources.
- **Plus so much more;** the first tier of local government, with 19 elected councillors working across the parish, a distribution centre for online orders of recycling sacks (one of only a few across the city) as well as the provision of dog waste bags, events and activities, host to job club, fitness clubs, Community Café, craft club, breakfast groups and loads more.


We make every penny count. We will continue to look at how we can bring resources in from other places and we know that we don’t get fair funding in Woughton, compared to other areas (we get around half the amount we should get).

# *Everything's coming up all clover!*

The environment team are trying a new approach to the weed and long grass problem around the trees and under street signs. We are sowing clover seeds in these areas to see if it will suppress the weeds without the need for spraying or strimming. Clover will withstand drought better than grass, and it is very beneficial to bees and other pollinators. At the moment we are trialling in Coffee Hall and Peartree Bridge. If successful we will try other estates.

Under ascot railing the plan is to sow Achillea Millefolium (white yarrow), which is taller than clover, but just as beneficial to insects.


We have also now planted tulip and crocus bulbs under the Coffee Hall notice board on Chapter, with summer flowers to follow.


