

Play Day is not included, therefore at least 1,300 engagements are not included here. This is because we have counted only authentic, meaningful engagements in these numbers.

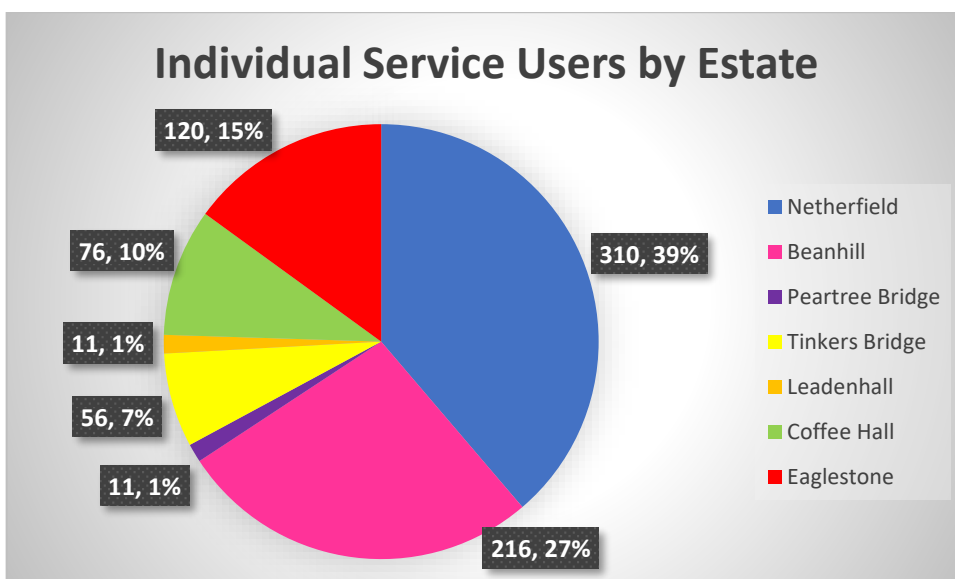
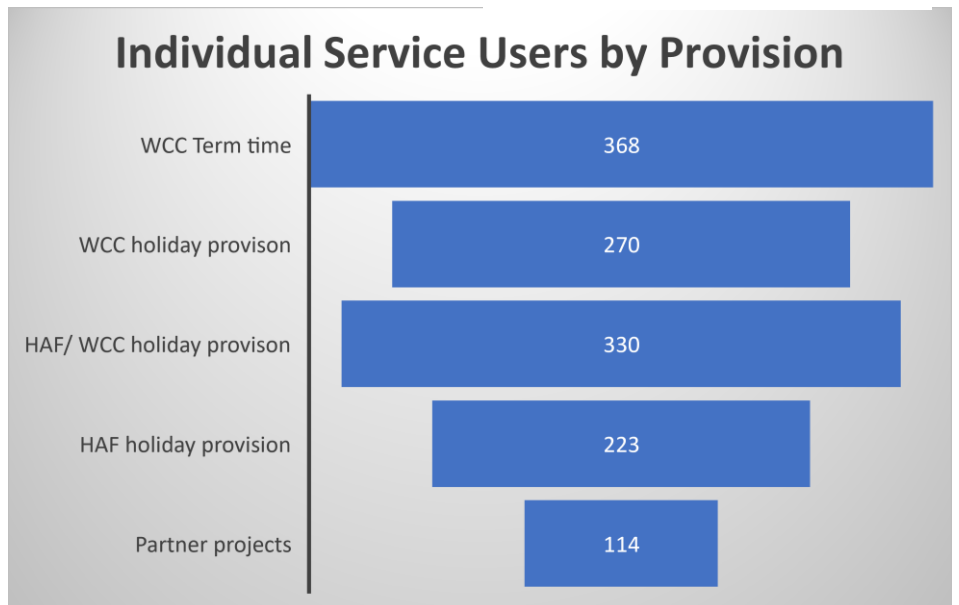
The youth team conducted over 5,000 meaningful engagements with children and young people in 2022.

We know that trusted engagements result in better outcomes for young people.

Individual service users represent one specific person. Displayed here in terms of the provision used to engage them.

Our interaction levels are highest in our weekly routine projects. However, when holiday provisions are added together the reach is vast.

When the offer is varied, regardless of delivery mode or partner, WCC youth team are central in the planning and delivery. The needs & strengths of Woughton residents are always prioritised.



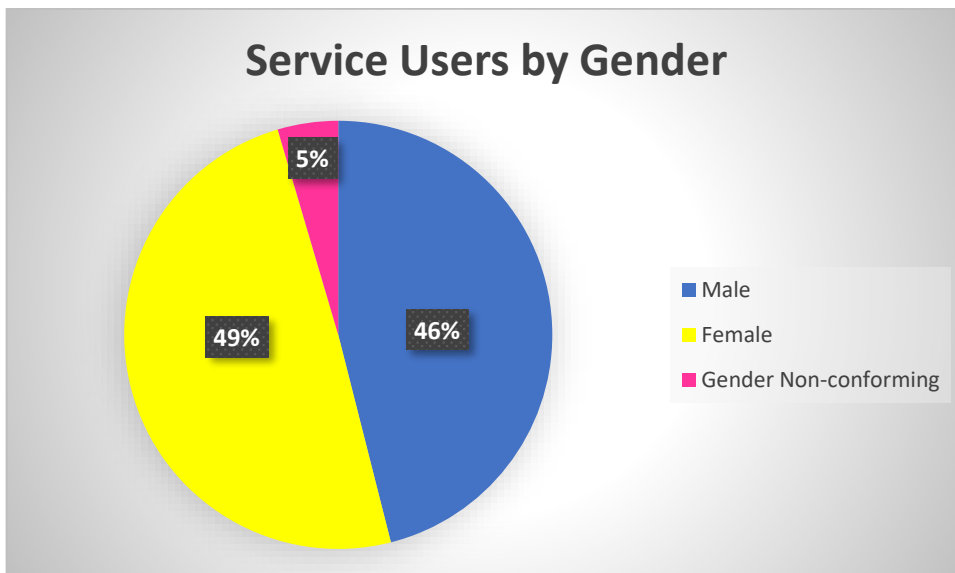
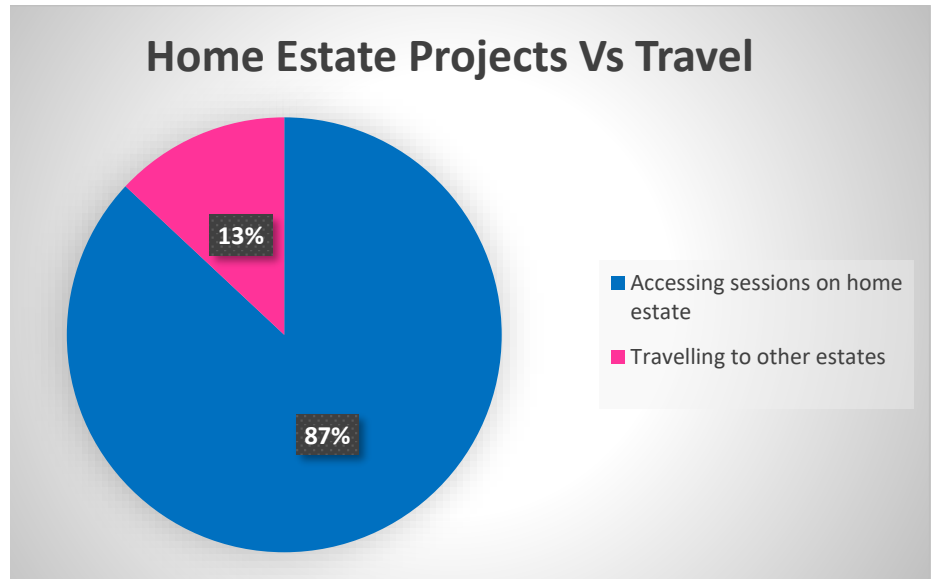
These figures represent term time project attendance by individual service users and estate hosts.

Data showed that there was movement across estates but having a project on estate resulted in highest chance of engagement there, unsurprisingly.

In 2022 we had 41 non-resident service users within the Youth Service. 10 were paying members of Phoenix Arts, the others were through HAF bookings for summer projects.

Interestingly, the numbers for home estate / host projects Vs projects travelled to, were different for term time and holiday provisions but they came out at the same percentages. 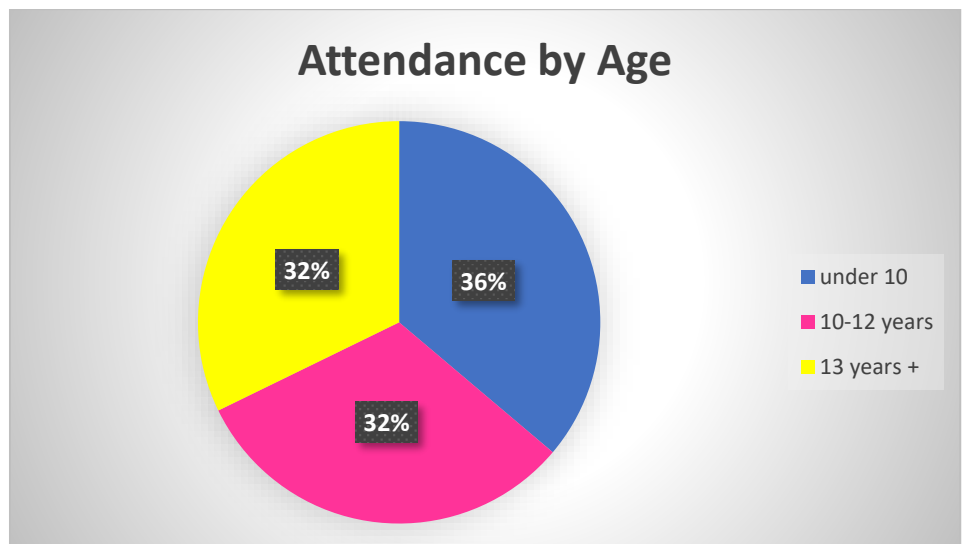


Percentages offered as a readable measure of uptake based on gender. It is testament to a varied and inclusive service to have fairly even numbers of the two main gender groups.

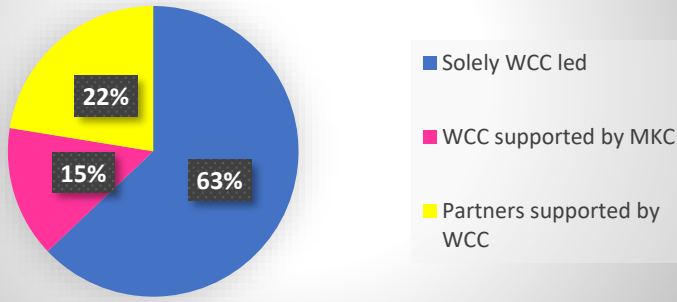
These percentages are accurately proportionate but not representative of all. Gender is becoming increasingly fluid and transient and asking gender is becoming more unappreciated and a less reliable source of data.

Again, the even split of ages attending our projects is indicative of a varied youth service. It shows, like the gender and term / holiday offers that one size of offer does not fit all.

We have a varied, diverse and inclusive programme over the year which this evidence suggests genuinely has something for everyone at some point.

The Youth Service has worked hard to build partnerships with other professional bodies and organisations.

We can offer our residents a broader range of projects, incorporating sessions that sit outside our teams' areas of expertise. We want the best for our residents, so it makes sense to capitalize on every opportunity for an enhanced offer.

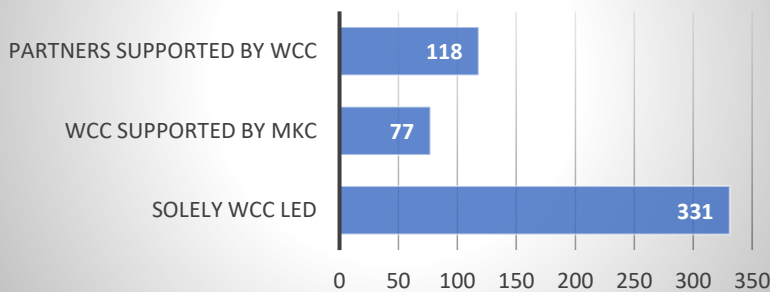
We do this in two ways

A) By hosting specialist providers to deliver on parish so our residents have easier access to these specialisms that travel or cost is likely to prevent. The Youth team have little input into specific session content in these cases. Eg: Phoenix Arts & Under The Umbrella

B) By utilising / seconding staff and sometimes resources from other settings to deliver projects designed by us. Co delivering under the management of WCC Youth Manager. Eg: Young Parents Group & Healthy Living.

These model almost doubles our service offer.

Service Users in WCC / Partner Funded Projects



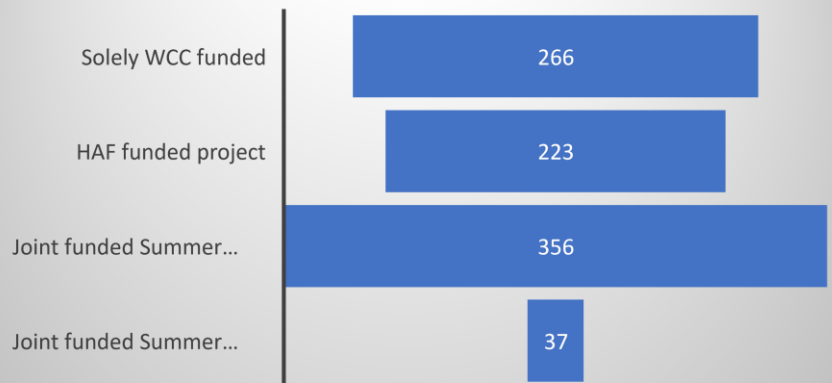
These charts are included to offer a visual overview of how many individual service users are reached through projects funded by the different budget lines / funding streams.

WCC fully or partially funds 69% of all projects we deliver.

We are able to deliver a wider offer through the grant funding gained. However, these are additional and all projects deemed necessary and ongoing are covered by precept.

NB: Even those projects funded by HAF and other grants are designed and delivered with our residents needs and strengths in mind.
